



South Euclid residents with foreclosure problems can get free legal advice May 22

SOUTH EUCLID -- The city of South Euclid and The Legal Aid

Society of Cleveland will host a free legal advice clinic focused on

foreclosure issues from 4-6 p.m. May 22 at the South Euclid

Community Center, 1370 Victory Drive.

Individuals facing foreclosure are encouraged to attend. Those who attend will be assisted by volunteer lawyers from the city and Legal Aid staff.

The foreclosure crisis persists nationwide and locally. Between 2006-11, there were 1,326 foreclosure filings for South Euclid properties. There are more than 600 vacant homes in South Euclid and 14.4 percent of the housing stock has been in foreclosure since 2006.

Lawyers for the event were recruited by Ed Icove, a lawyer and South Euclid councilman.
