Vintage bombers on their way

Three World War II-vintage bombers will soon be flying into Northeast Ohio. The MAPS Air Museum will feature a B-17, B-24 and B-25 on Aug. 7, 8 and 9 at Akron-Canton Regional Airport. The aircraft belong to the Collings Foundation, where officials say their B-24 is the only one flying in the world. The cost to tour the aircraft and the MAPS museum is \$10 for adults and \$5 for children. Thirty-minute flights aboard the bombers are also available, for \$325 to \$425.
