

Save Money... File Taxes for Free!

Free Tax Preparation

You can have your taxes prepared for free and get your refund within 10 days.

Find out about free tax preparation in your area:

- Call First Call for Help (dial 211 from your phone); or
- Call the IRS at 1-800-829-1040, or go to www.irs.gov to find information about Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) programs.

Most people who file their tax return electronically with a free preparer will get their refund direct deposited into their bank account within 10 days - and it is free! Even if you cannot open a checking account, you may be able to have your refund deposited into a savings account.

What if I want to pay to have my taxes prepared?

DOs

- Use a tax preparer recommended by someone you trust, who has been trained, and who will be available to answer questions for years after you file.
- Use a tax preparer who signs your tax return and includes the preparer's "PTIN" number.
- Be sure the preparer has all of your income information to prepare your tax return correctly.
- Review your return before you sign it, check everything no matter who prepares it, and ask questions about anything you don't understand.
- Obtain all copies of the forms the preparer is filing for you, even if the returns are filed electronically.

DON'Ts

- Use a tax preparer who claims they can get you larger refunds.
- Use a tax preparer who charges a percentage of the refund. They are not allowed to do this.
- Use car dealers, furniture or jewelry stores, or payday lenders who offer to prepare your taxes and use your refund for a purchase or a cash advance; doing so will only cost you money in fees and interest.
- Sign a blank tax form.
- Fall for offers of "fast cash refunds," "express money," "instant refunds," Christmas refunds, or other refunds that are not based on your tax return or your total income information; these "refunds" are actually loans that cost you fees and interest.

REMEMBER THAT YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL OF THE INFORMATION ON YOUR TAX RETURN. MAKE SURE IT IS CORRECT.

Special rules may apply if you have been a victim of identity theft. Be sure to tell your tax preparer if your social security number was ever used by someone else without your permission.

If the IRS claims your return is wrong or says you didn't file, call The Legal Aid Society of Cleveland at 888-817-3777.
