



Legal Aid's mission is to secure justice and resolve fundamental problems for those who are low income and vulnerable by providing high quality legal services and working for systemic solutions.

Legal Aid's mission statement was developed in the 2007 strategic planning process and guides Legal Aid's work. The strategic plan recognizes Legal Aid's organizational strength and the potential for greater achievement to preserve rights, maintain dignity and ensure justice. Legal Aid's 2007 – 2010 goals include:

#### **Access to Justice**

To ensure access to justice for low income people, Legal Aid seeks to:

- Increase capacity to serve more clients
- Increase pro bono support
- Expand reach to people with limited English proficiency and other underserved and vulnerable populations
- Track information regarding unmet needs to better inform organizational priorities

### **Economics and Education**

The line between reasonable comfort and financial ruin is a fine line for many. Education provides access to a better future. Because of Legal Aid's work:

- Clients' income will increase
- Clients' assets will be protected
- Clients' barriers to employment, vocational training and education will be removed
- The rights of clients with regard to income and assets, employment and education will be preserved

#### Health, Shelter, and Safety

Communities are strengthened when health care is accessible, housing is decent and affordable and safety is not an issue. Because of Legal Aid's work:

- Clients and their families who are victims of domestic violence, abuse or neglect will be safe
- Clients will secure and retain decent, affordable housing
- The stock of decent, affordable housing will be maintained, despite pressures to shrink
- Clients and their families will have increased access to health care
- The rights of clients with regard to safety, housing and health will be preserved

#### **Marketing / External Communications**

In order to communicate its mission and better serve clients, Legal Aid seeks to:

- Develop and implement a mission-based external communications plan
- Increase the number of people in the client and legal communities who understand that Legal Aid provides high quality legal services and is a valuable contributor to the Northeast Ohio community

#### **Finances and Fund Development**

Legal Aid's course is supported by solid finances and increased ability to raise funds. Legal Aid's goals are:

- Increase total revenues to \$10 million, including \$1 million from the Annual Campaign for Legal Aid
- Diversify funding
- Establish a reserve and an endowment
- Appropriately and strategically allocate resources among locations, programs, administration and development

#### **Human Resources and Culture**

Human resources are Legal Aid's greatest asset. To support this asset and develop a culture devoted to client service, Legal Aid seeks to:

- Enhance organizational unity
- Develop multi-cultural competencies
- Develop succession plans for all leadership positions
- Establish competitive compensation packages
- Develop the use of work plans and evaluations
- Increase the number of staff including paralegals, social workers and technology staff
- Improve board performance, setting goals and assessing progress




