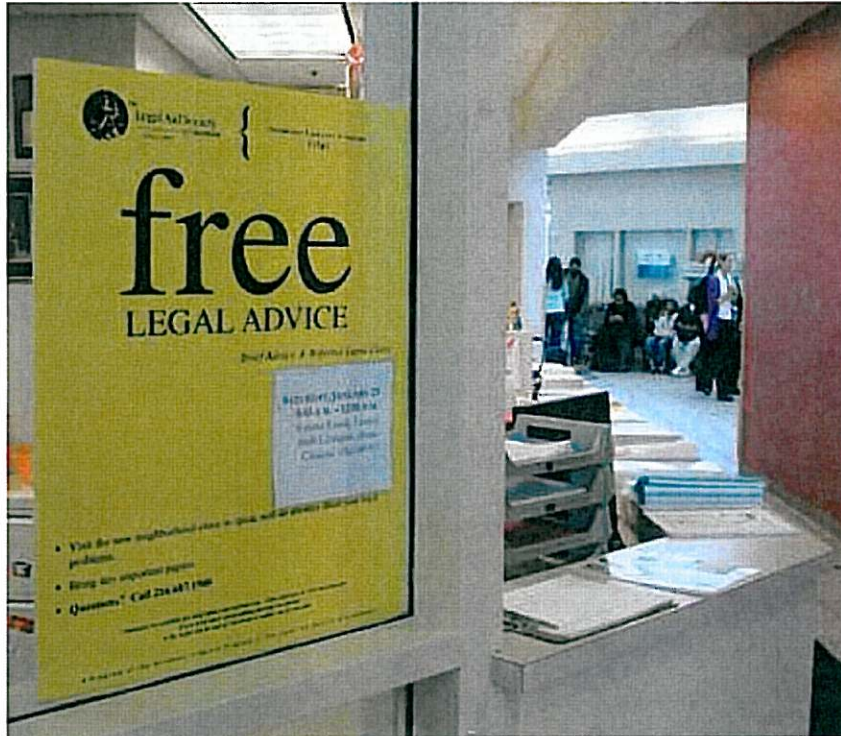




Legal Aid Society offers free legal help East and West Side locations

CLEVELAND, Ohio — The **Legal Aid Society of Cleveland** offers assistance to low-income residents at its Warehouse District office and at community centers.

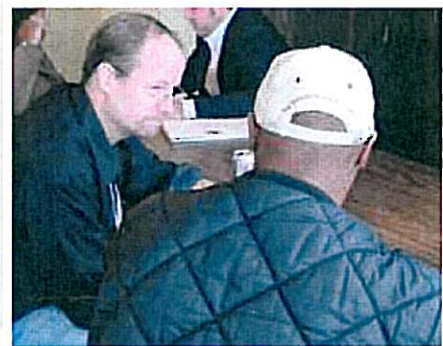
This Saturday, attorneys will offer legal advice beginning at 9:45 a.m. at the St. Martin de Porres Family Center, 1264 East 123rd St.

Legal Aid attorneys cannot take on criminal cases. They help with civil problems, like landlord disputes, rent-to-own contracts and getting special education, housing, employment, social services, tax refunds, loans and Social Security benefits.
