[March 15, 2023], Cleveland, Ohio - The Ohio Workforce Coalition (OWC) is excited to announce the members of the Cleveland | Cuyahoga Workforce Leadership Academy (Academy), a fellowship designed to build capacity in the local workforce ecosystem and present innovative solutions to challenges faced by workers or businesses.

The yearlong Academy was developed by the Aspen Institute Economic Opportunities Program and launched in Ohio by the OWC in partnership with the Northeast Ohio Workforce Coalition (NEOWC). The Academy engages leaders in retreats and workshops as they come together to advance innovation and equity. "Ohio's workforce ecosystems are full of professionals committed to jobseekers, front-line workers, and employers." said Rebecca Kusner, Director of OWC. She added "We hope to create a space where they can engage in deep discussions, grow relationships, and build their knowledge of local systems and how systems can evolve."
