The Clinic is an opportunity for an attorney to help an individual by meeting one on one with that person about his or her problem. The attorney commitment for the Brief Advice & Referral Clinic is limited to trying to help with advice or direction. The clients are advised of that limited commitment at the intake triage so that there is no misunderstanding about the level of service being provided. After interviewing the individual, the attorney will advise the person what course of action is recommended or needed, if any. Staff from Legal Aid is available at the clinic to support the volunteers with helpful materials, with internet access for docket checking, and to help with other issues or questions that may arise. Legal Aid's malpractice insurance covers pro bono activities. Under Ohio Supreme Court rule, pro bono attorneys can earn CLE credits for recognized pro bono activities. Legal Aid tracks and reports the earned hours of CLE to the CLE Commission.
